





between the blues and jazz, between the delta and the gulf. In the 1950s, when the influence of rock-and-roll

Clifton Chenier's music was culturally

and rhythm-and-blues inspired changes, Clifton succeeded in translating his zydeco sound into modern terms. Clifton carefully built what he perceptively named the Red Hot Louisiana Band.


Clifton hit the national music scene in 1964 with Chris Strachwitz's Arhoolie label for whom he made some of his most memorable recordings. Nationally and at home he also attracted

the attention of young, hip white crowds. Clifton's growing popularity soon raced past the social barriers of the times and he became a mainstay of student hangouts such as Willie Purple's and the legendary Jay's Lounge and Cockpit.

In March 1974, Clifton played the first Tribute to Cajun Music concert, which eventually evolved into Festivals Acadiens et Créoles. For the second installment of the concert, Clifton made a statement by appearing with a very conspicuous rhinestone-studded crown. Yet, the King of Zydeco maintained a warm closeness with his constituencies on the local zydeco circuit, regularly holding court over the bandstand rail in dance halls and over the backstage fence at festivals throughout South Louisiana and far beyond.

The festival is also happy to celebrate Lafayette Parish's Bicentennial. So, join us as we self-celebrate the past 200 years of where we live, how we play music, how we eat, how we dance and how we speak!
